Policy change

- Not lobby but education and advocacy is valued, legit and needed. Public meetings more accessible
- Jackie shared the TMOD Policy Priorities for 2021 including removing penalties for youth use of tobacco/ vape.
- Who interested? Beth, Liliana, youth leadership
- Beth: Our legislators know us; also Dow, McDermit... Proposes this council develop a list of items for legislators to respond to.
- We have a history with our youth being powerful influencers. 2+ years ago a Cascade approached King County Council to have a Homeless Shelter be housed by the park, rather than for men for families. This was heard and this became Mary's Place.

Public Awareness Campaign

- In past there have been bill boards commonly. Patricia recalls the Did You Know campaign o social media – Lets use their instant access to do some social media campaigning
- Work with Advisory teachers (HSD) that they could play during advisories or health teachers could bring to class. Kim suggested learning from DOH about ongoing campaigns and also the HSD Cartoon campaign. Connect with King County as well (Jody). Marissa mentioned another coalition had youth engage in a poster contest with winner was posted on billboard. Liliana would offer this up as an art project for her club!
